The Role

AIEF Pathways Advisors work with AIEF Scholarship Students to prepare and support them to make a successful transition from school to employment or higher education.

This involves delivering programs that provide age appropriate support and activities to Indigenous students throughout their years in secondary school, individual one-on-one case management for transition of Year 12 students to post school study or employment, and support of the AIEF Mentor Program.

You will work professionally with AIEF Partner Schools, AIEF Mentors, Corporate Partners and other external stakeholders to achieve the best outcomes for Indigenous students.

As an AIEF Pathways Advisor, you will:

- Build and maintain trusting and respectful relationships with students so that AIEF is their 'go to' for career advice and support.
- Deliver the AIEF Pathways Program in accordance with AIEF policies and procedures and within agreed timelines.
- Support and develop strong, trusting relationships between students and volunteer mentors.
